# Best Practice-I

## 1. Title of the Practice

Publication of College Magazine, *Shivdarshan*

## 2. Objectives of the Practice

The practice of publishing the college magazine, *Shivdarshan* has several important purposes. The objectives are as follows-

1. To provide a platform for students to express their creativity through writing in regional language, Marathi and English.
2. To promote College Culture such as values of the institution, tradition and achievements
3. To foster Communication between different departments, students, and faculty, by keeping everyone informed about college events, news, and updates in Marathi and English language.
4. To document College History through annual reports, photographs with all the data for future use.

## 3. The Context

The process of publishing the magazine involves participation of students and their interest in creative writing. Students need motivation and the editors work hard to mould the ideas of students to write literature in language with literary touch. Students who wish to write in English need more efforts and the work of editors become challenging.

Collecting reports from all the Departments and Committees in time is another important challenge. The Head of the Departments and In Charge of Committees are notified to submit the reports within time. The reports are rectified and then forwarded for publication.

The printing expenditure is another challenge for this practice. A separate financial provision is made for the publication of the Magazine in the annual budget of the institution.

## 4. The Practice

Publishing a college magazine is creative and collaborative activity in an educational institution. Initially the meeting of editorial board with principal was organized. A notice for the collection of creative literature was circulated among students. Students editors were also selected. The literature received from students was edited. Reports from all Departments and Committees were also collected. After careful editing work the data was sent to Printing Press. After the correction in typing and other work **1000 copies** of College Magazine, *Shivdarshan* were published. All the stakeholders were given one copy each of the college magazine.

## 5. Evidence of Success

Students gave good response to the Practice. Many students submitted creative literature. The editorial board selected 15 Articles written in regional Marathi language and nine articles in English language. Two poems in English language were also selected for publication. After editing it the selected literature of *Shri Shivaji Science & Arts College, Chikhli, Dist. Buldana. 443201 (M.S.)*

students was published. Fifteen Departments reports belonging to faculty of Science, Humanities and Commerce are published. Twenty-six reports of different committees are also published. In the magazine photographs of different activities, achievements of faculty and students were also published. Six copies of magazine are also submitted to university. The Magazine is well received by all the stakeholders of the institution.

#### **6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

It is not an easy task to motivate students to try their hand at creative writing. After collection of literature, the editors need to work to refine the literature received from students. The printing expenditure is also another challenge. Separate provision needed in the annual budget of the college.

We can divide cybersecurity into two parts one is cyber, and the other is security. Cyber refers to the technology that includes systems, networks, programs, and data. Security is concerned with the protection of systems, networks, applications, and information. In some cases, it is also called electronic information security or information technology security.

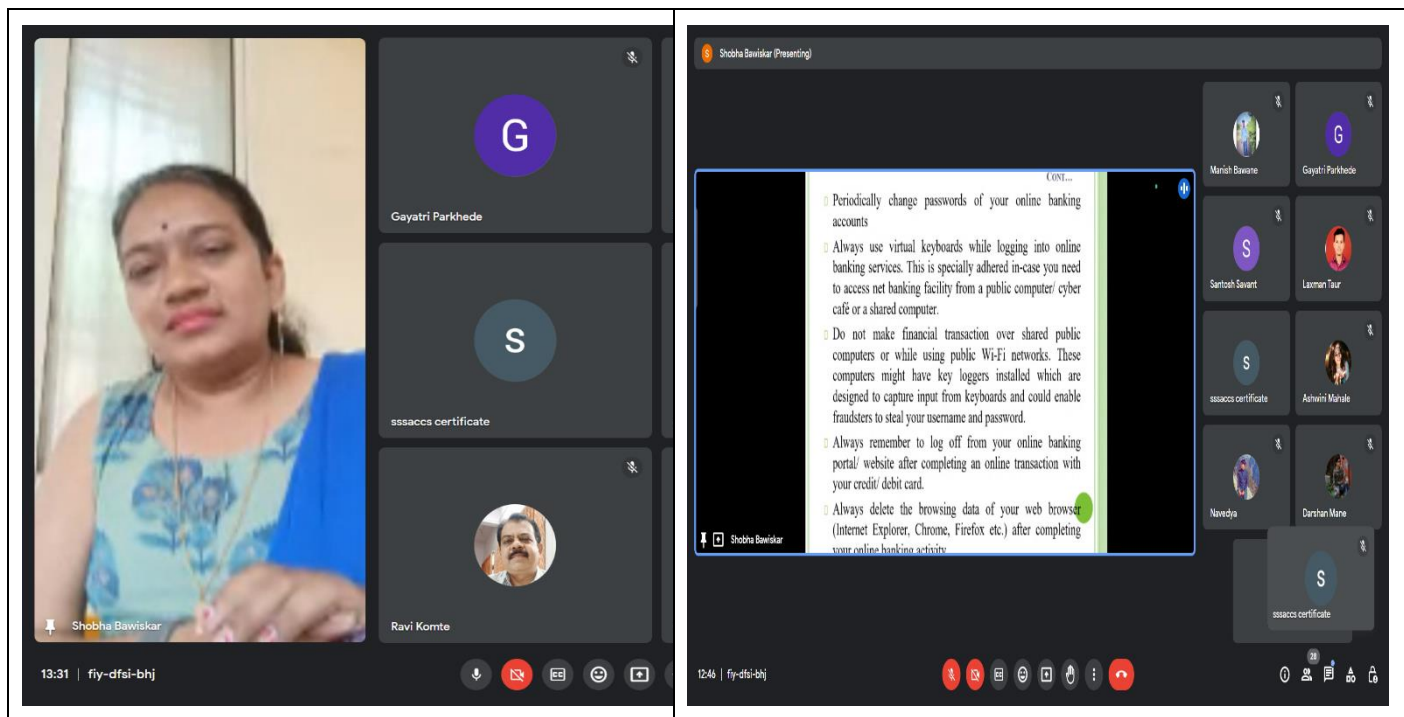

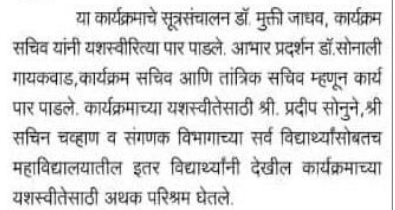
